What the current plans say

Implementation	Assessment
Consultation – <i>“encourages applicants to consult with tangata whenua over development proposals within the coastal marine area...”</i>	Green
Decision Making – <i>“Provide for a tangata whenua representative... in taiapure and maataitai reserves and waters classified for cultural purposes”</i>	Red
Advice and Information sharing – <i>“Provide advice and information to tangata whenua...”</i>	Green
Monitoring – <i>“commits to investigating options for tangata whenua involvement in monitoring...”</i>	Orange
Iwi/ Hapu Management Plans – <i>“that the council will assist... in the development of iwi management plans for resources within their rohe”</i>	Orange

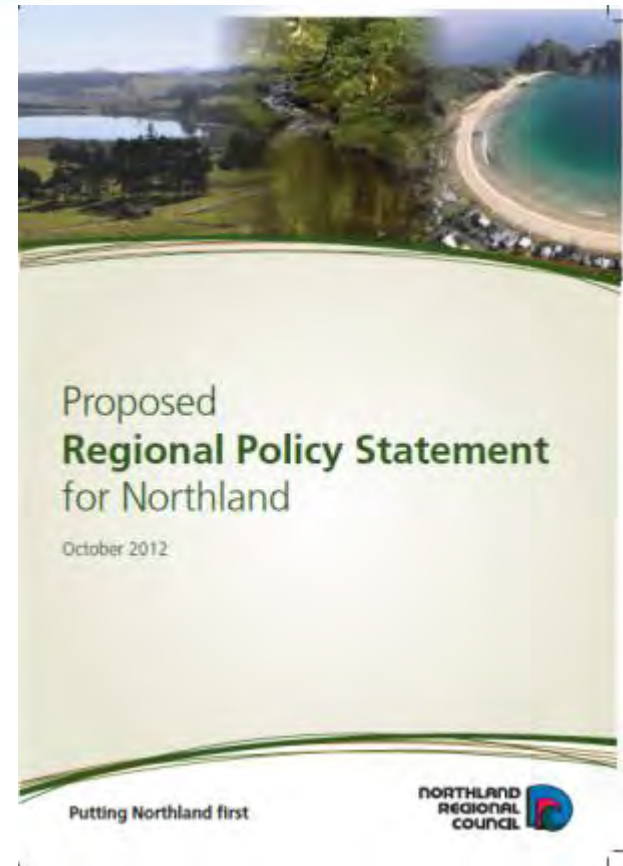
