Litter traps stop rubbish

To determine how much plastic and other litter is reaching Taitokerau rivers and estuaries annually, we're working with NorthTec, Northland District Health Board, Whitebait Connection and the region's three district councils to install 'LittaTraps'.

The devices are simple, cost-effective nets that fit inside stormwater grates, trapping plastic and other litter that would otherwise be carried by stormwater straight to the sea. As part of the study, 50 traps have been installed around Northland to capture a variety of different land uses, including playgrounds, carparks, and fast food premises.

The traps are audited every three months to estimate how much plastic finds its way into the sea.

Civil Defence emergency management

The recent tsunami evacuation saw Northlanders pull together to keep ourselves and our communities safe. The Northland Civil Defence Emergency Management (CDEM) Group manages the emergency response for occasions such as tsunami evacuations, COVID-19 alert levels, and flooding. Northland Regional Council and the region's district councils are members of this group, alongside emergency services and other agencies. The Civil Defence and hazard management rate helps fund Civil Defence – providing you with information and resources to prepare for, respond to, and recover from emergency events, and promotes emergency management throughout Northland.

Educating our future

Nā te kukune, te pupuke

The Enviroschools Project Pest Control courses provide opportunities for students, including educational qualifications, (NCEA credits) and career pathways into the pest control industry. Kaipara secondary schools joined the Kai Iwi Lakes course in March, with Whangārei and Far North training to begin in June/July.

Students learn about the biology and impact of animal pests, how to trap and kill them humanely using trapline, and skin possums and pluck fur.

The Enviroschools WaiRestoration project gives students insight into our relationship with fresh water and how past and present practices affect the mauri of waterways. One WaiRestoration component is WaiFencing - with 75 students recently learning how to build fences to keep stock away from waterways on Donagh farm in Whangārei. A similar course will take place on the Karikari Peninsula.
