Background/Tuhinga

The Joint Committee is comprised of elected members from the Far North District Council (FNDC), Kaipara District Council (KDC), Northland Regional Council (NRC) and Whangarei District Council (WDC). The Joint Committee is a joint standing committee of the councils as provided for under Clause 30(1) of Schedule 7 of the Local Government Act 2002 and shall operate in accordance with the provisions of Clause 30A of Schedule 7. According to the latter, the Joint Committee is required to appoint a Chair.

The appointment of the Chair at the first meeting of the Joint Committee for the 2025-28 triennium will provide appropriate leadership of the Joint Committee and support the delivery of its functions. A key role of the Chair will be to ensure that all activities undertaken by the Joint Committee maximise as far as possible achievements of the strategic objectives.

The Terms of Reference of the Joint Committee (**Attachment 1**), under the Section "Committee Chair and Deputy Chair" specify that the Chair is to be elected by members at the first meeting of the Joint Committee according to System A of Clause 25 of Schedule 7 of the Local Government Act 2002. A

description of System A of the Clause 25 of Schedule 7 of the Local Government Act 2002 is provided below:

System A –

requires that a person is elected or appointed if he or she receives the votes of a majority of the members of the local authority or committee present and voting; and

has the following characteristics:

there is a first round of voting for all candidates; and

if no candidate is successful in that round there is a second round of voting from which the candidate with the fewest votes in the first round is excluded; and

if no candidate is successful in the second round there is a third; and if necessary, a subsequence round of voting from which, each time, the candidate with the fewest votes in the previous round is excluded; and

in any round of voting, if two or more candidates tie for the lowest number of votes, the person excluded from the next round is resolved by lot.

if no candidate is successful in the second round there is a third; and if necessary, a subsequence round of voting from which, each time, the candidate with the fewest votes in the previous round is excluded; and

in any round of voting, if two or more candidates tie for the lowest number of votes, the person excluded from the next round is resolved by lot.
