Terms and Conditions

Background

Northland Regional Council's scholarship aims to recognise and support students to undertake study, research or training that aligns with council's area of focus and mission of 'working together to create a healthy environment, strong economy and resilient communities'.

Conditions

1. The scholarship shall be known as the **Tū i te ora Scholarship**.
2. The recipient must be a New Zealand citizen or permanent resident of New Zealand.
3. The recipient must reside in, have family that reside in, or have whakapapa (a genealogical connection) to Taitokerau.
4. The recipient is enrolled as a full-time or part-time student at an approved tertiary institution.
5. The recipient is required to provide evidence of completion and results for the papers enrolled in as per the confirmation of study provided.
6. The scholarship will have a value of **\$3,000** and is tenable for one year.
7. The scholarship will be applied to tuition fees for the academic programme which the recipient is enrolled in for 2021, or to assist with costs associated with undertaking tertiary study.
8. The scholarship is required to be repaid in full should the recipient withdraw from the enrolled course and does not add sufficient papers to maintain enrolment for the 2021 academic year.
9. The scholarship may be held in conjunction with other scholarships and awards the recipient receives from other organisations or trusts.
10. The recipient agrees to be available to Northland Regional Council for publicity and promotional activities including but not limited to, videography, photography, presentations and for use in marketing material for future scholarships.
11. In signing and returning the notification of acceptance of the Tū i te ora Scholarship, the recipient will be deemed to have read, understood and accepted the conditions of the scholarship.
