Climate Club is all about making meaningful climate action accessible to everyone. We are currently offering our two-part Ripple Workshops free for year 7-13 students in Te Taitokerau schools thanks to funding from Northland Regional Council!

This workshop is designed for students to develop confidence and motivation for climate action, wherever they are on their journey from anxiety to empowerment. It is participatory, strengths based and solutions focused!

It covers:

HOW IT WORKS

- key areas for emissions reduction in Aotearoa NZ and Te Taitokerau Northland
- inspiring examples of youth climate action
- activities to plan everyday and community climate actions.

Students will **finish** as **groups** with simple action ideas to turn into projects. For best results we encourage teachers to revisit these for about 15 minutes a week for the month following the workshops.

The first part of the workshop will stand alone in a **one hour** class block, and the second part is a follow up lesson about a month later, to deepen and integrate learnings.

Kaiako are encouraged to work with their enviroschools facilitators to continue climate teaching and learning for the term.

The workshop is intended for Year 7 - 13 students with the content adaptable to fit the specific class context.

Workshops are run by our experienced Ripple Effect facilitators.
