Health and Safety implementation

Provide support and information to the H&S Manager for example, research, writing of reports, statistical analysis.

Adhere to all safe working procedures and instructions, taking care of oneself and others. Having a commitment to health and safety as detailed in the NRC policies and guidelines, and as defined by the Health and Safety Legislation.

Advice and support

Provide support and timely accurate advice (basic through to mid-level advice) to our people. This includes but is not limited to legislative compliance, risk management delivery including process/procedure development, risk review, health monitoring and implementing appropriate controls.

Reporting, incident management, investigations and inspections

Assist in accurate recording and reporting of health and safety information and where required assist with incident management, investigations and inspections.

Undertake Civil Defence Emergency Management responsibilities if required.
