The table above set out the scores attributed to various values of surf breaks in the Shipwreck Bay (Te Kohanga) area near Ahipara. The scores range between 1 and 10. With 10 being highly valued and 1 being of low value.

Eighty-two surf breaks around Northlands coast were assessed to record their values and to determine their relative significance. Some attributes have a greater influence over the significance of a break than others. For that reason, some attributes (e.g. wave quality) have been given more weight than others.

The breaks have been assigned one of the following three categories;

- Nationally significant surf breaks are those breaks that are identified in Schedule 1 of the New Zealand Coastal Policy Statement 2010
- Regionally significant surf breaks are those with a weighted total greater than the threshold for regional significance (threshold = 31)
- Other surf breaks are those breaks that were assessed and have a weighted total less than the threshold for regional significance.

Surf breaks in Northland were assessed in line with;
