Introduction

1. This memorandum of counsel has been prepared on behalf of the submitter,

the Director-General of Conservation (DGC). It refers to Directions No. 3 and

No. 4 of the Hearing Panel dated 21 August 2023 and 25 August 2023

respectively (the "Directions").

2. Direction No. 3 extended the time for the Applicant to file its evidence from

24 August to 28 August 2023, which the applicant has met with the filing of

their evidence on 28 August 2023.

3. Direction No. 4 granted an extension of time for Patuharakeke Te lwi Trust

for a commensurate extension of two working days to file its expert submitter

evidence.

4. The DGC requests a commensurate extension of two working days to file its

expert submitter evidence, on the following basis:

a) Northport is the only potentially affected party, and their counsel's

memorandum seeking an extension appropriately acknowledged that

Northport Ltd would be willing to agree to a similar extension for submitter

evidence;

b) Patuharakeke Te Iwi Trust have been granted an extension of two working

days to file its expert submitter evidence;

c) DGC's expert witnesses and counsel have also had very heavy workloads

in their respective areas.
