

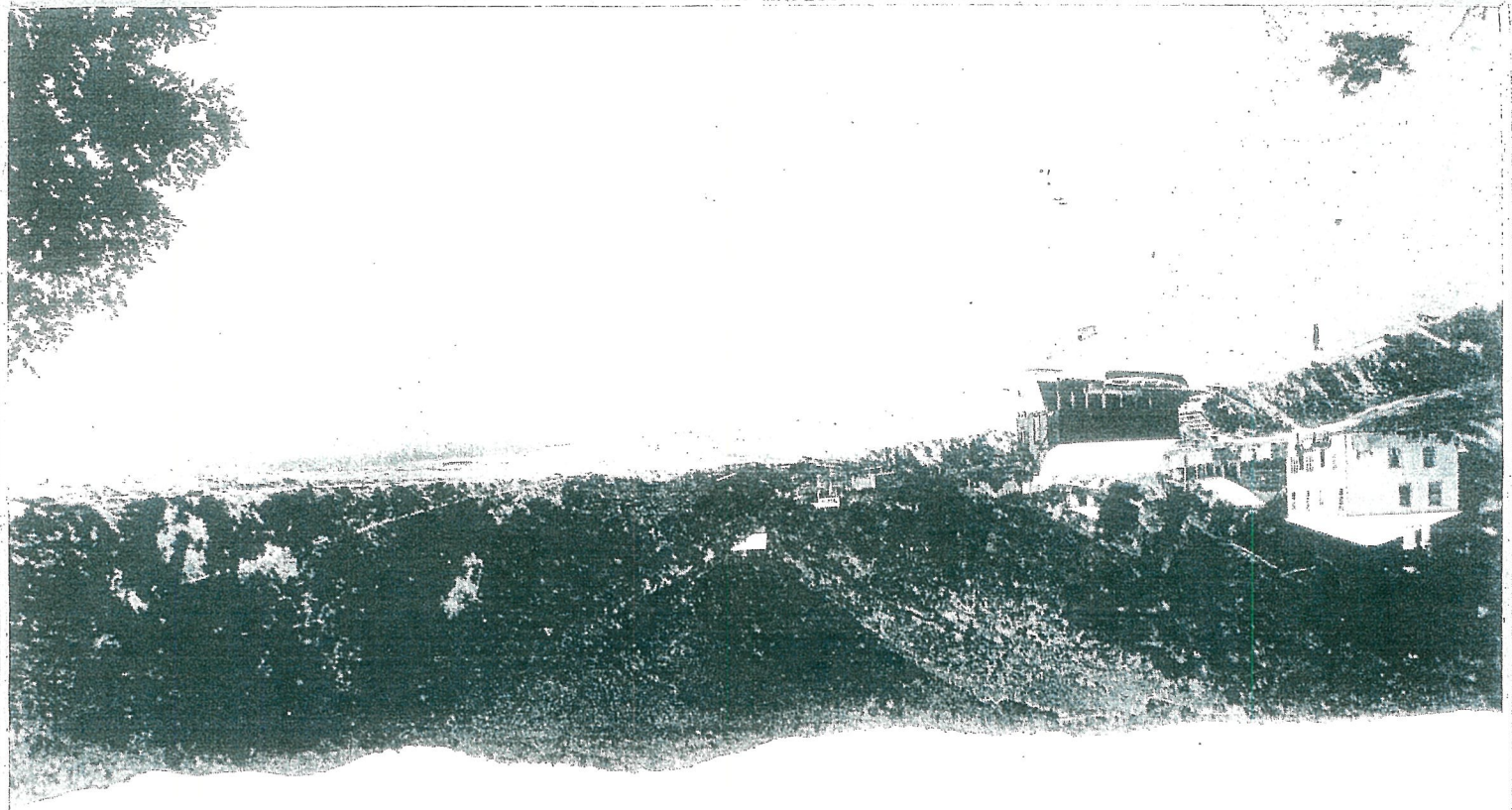
Now that the Boat Yard no longer uses its own private land for repairs and maintenance, this activity should not be permitted to be transferred onto the Esplanade Reserve or into the CMA as per Page 3. "mudcrete grids and 3 work berths for vessel maintenance."

All work pertaining to The Boat Yard should be conducted on private Boatyard land. Failing this all easements/resource consents should be rendered null and void. The Esplanade Reserve cleared and revert to its Traditional state as a picnic/swimming space.

The waterway between the coast line and mooring area must be retained in the interests of water safety.

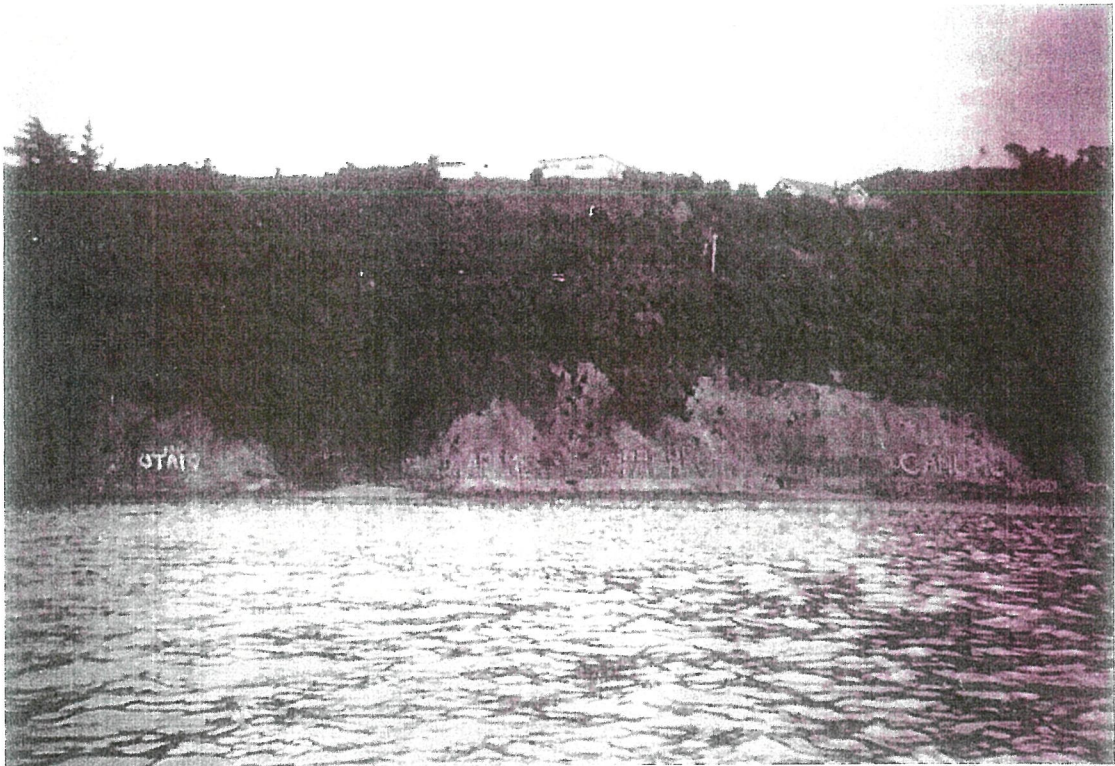

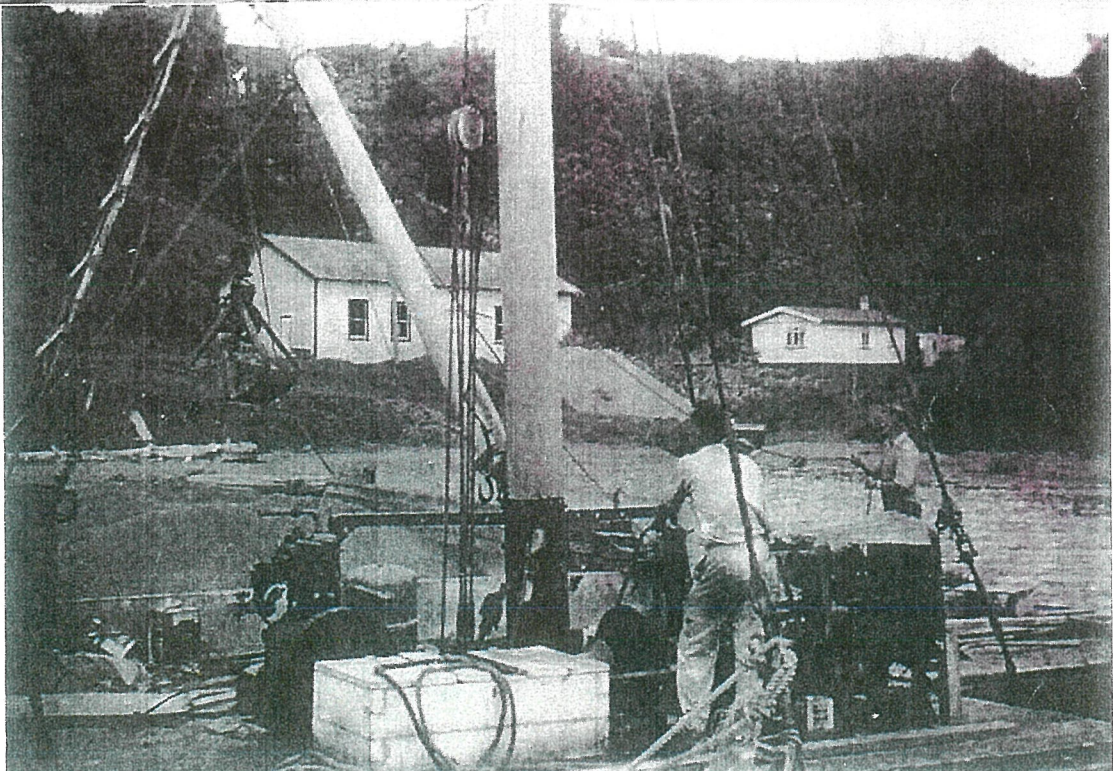
5. Cliff face showing ships names engraved by crew members of visiting cargo vessels.

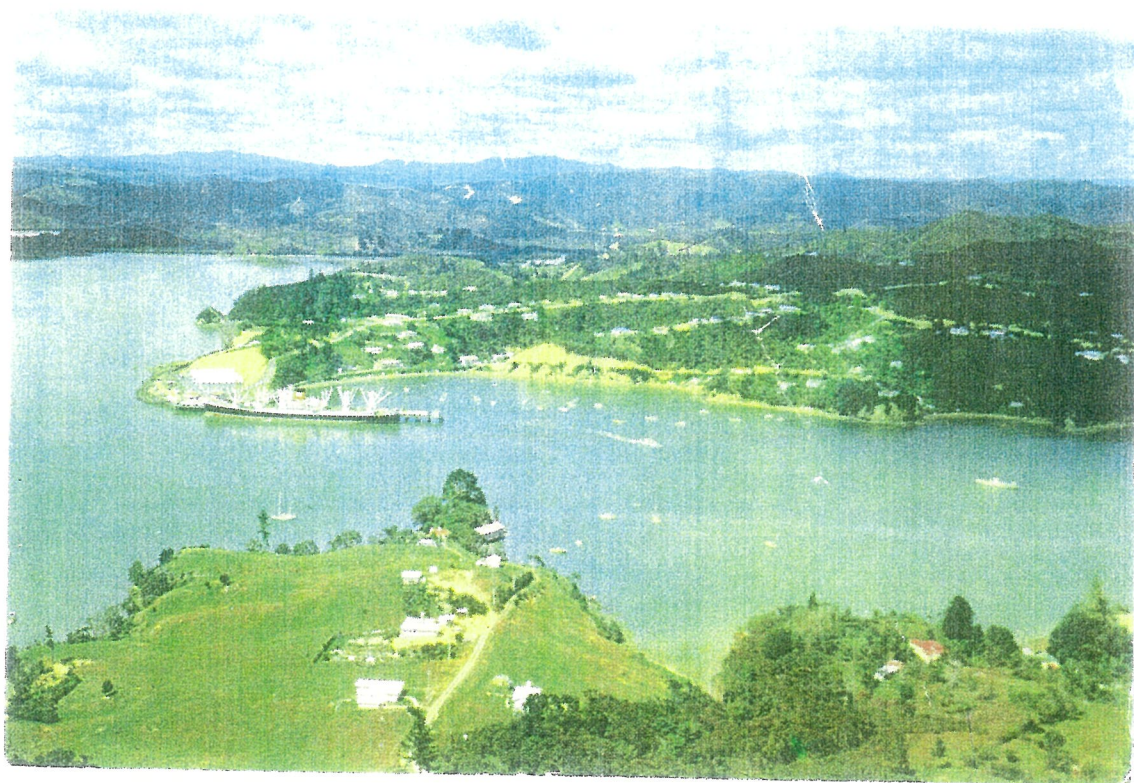
